In the increasingly distant past of 1996, Neville Kennedy, along with a group of like-minded individuals, came together to form a Barbershop Harmony Chorus. Initially meeting at the local Teachers' College, Manawatunes was born. The likes of Andy Hutson and David Birdling from Harbour Capital Chorus were instrumental in helping the Manawatunes set up the chorus and go on to win the Small Chorus Section at Convention Rotorua 1997.

These early years are notable for a strong group of singers with a drive to perform to the best of their ability. These years are marked by the successful *Heartsong* Convention in Year 2000 with headline quartet Jokers Wild and fun songs like Southern Roses, the Railroad Rag and Myfawnwy.

In 2012, our founder and Musical Director Neville left us for sunnier climes. Irreplaceable as Neville was, we found able Musical leadership under the baton of Stuart Johansen, who has led us to further success while expanding and modernising our repertoire somewhat. As Barbershop Harmony New Zealand Champion Small Chorus in 2019, 2018, 2014, 2010, 1999 and 1997, we're proud to have our name on the Manawatunes Trophy, for which small choruses vie. We're prouder still to be hosting The Power of Harmony and look forward to seeing you there!

ON THE DAY A competitor's journey



This is the big day, you are ready to shine before your peers. Well rehearsed and primed for vocal excellence, you look at the programme and see your time has come. Your Chorus is due to report.

Feeling primed and passionate to give it your best, you step out into the grand foyer of the Regent Theatre, pausing momentarily to take in the grandeur and glance at your competitors performing on the television in the foyer.

But it is time. You ascend the grand staircase, only pausing on the landing to adjust uniform in the vast mirror against the wall, and reach the mezzanine.

Waiting here is a smiling, welcoming usher. The chorus gathers around you, while the final paperwork is sorted. You gather in silence, prepared for what's ahead, not wanting to disturb the glories which are occurring in the auditorium so near.

"Shall we go, people", your usher leads you onward. You climb the stairs to the Rehearsal room and ascend the risers. You watch yourself in the mirrored wall as you go through your paces one last time. Your Musical Director beams at the glorious sound emanating from the chorus.

Then, all too soon, it is over. Your usher intones "It's nearly time for us to move on, please place your personal belongings in this box. One last swig from your convention water bottle, then in the box it goes and you're moving.

Down the stairs you go, to the very bowels of the theatre, so it seems. You approach a red door, where an impeccably groomed doorperson waits to let you out into the sunlight of the Regent Arcade.

Blinking in the glory of a typically gorgeous Palmy day, you walk Regent arcade. Tempted as you feel to stop for a drink at the Celtic Inn as you pass, you know full well that this is not the time, you know how disappointed you would be to miss the moments coming so soon.

You near the backstage door and pass through. Vaguely in the distance you can hear the applause as the chorus before you completes their set. As the applause dies, the vast stage door opens and you enter, stage left, to ascend the risers, ready for victory.

The curtains part. Your crowd awaits.

For quartets, your walkthrough will be similar to this dramatised one, but will allow for one more stop prior to stage to straighten up and feel ready.

Where there are stairs, a lift is available for those with mobility issues. Please let us know if you have any persons with such issues, and we'll be sure that accommodations are ready. We will ensure facilities exist, your chorus is responsible for providing a support person.
